As the country battled the destructive second COVID-19 wave, PI Industries displayed exemplary corporate social responsibility by offering innovative and agile solutions across India to fight the outbreak.

PI Foundation and its partners continuously organise awareness sessions on precautions against COVID-19 and screening of potential cases in villages around Jambusar and Panoli along with emphasizing on the vaccination drive initiated by the government with its availability at different centres. Mobile Health Van staff spread the message among community members and beneficiaries come to avail the health services.

Orientation of Community on Safety & Emergency Preparedness in surrounding villages of Plant at Jambusar & Panoli

Orientation of community members on health, safety, environment along with emergency preparedness have been conducted in Umarwada, Sanjali, Bakrol, Kapodara and Panoli of Ankleshwar taluka & Sarod, Nodhna, Uber, Vedach & Samoj of Jambusar taluka. This orientation was part of regular dialogue with community on Health, Safety, Environment & Emergency preparedness along with the Financial & Legal Literacy Training. 335 members from community participated in the program.

Sustainable Rice Production with the Conservation of Natural Resources through Direct Seeded Rice in Multiple States of India

PI Foundation has been working closely with farmers in the agriculturally backward region of the country to promote a farming system that is more sustainable - environmentally, economically, and socially. In association with State Agricultural Universities and NGOs.

Our field teams have been regularly conducting field days and farmer meetings keeping in view safety and necessity of precautions to be taken in this COVID-19 crisis.

Our field team propagates the benefits of Direct Seeded Rice (DSR) technique through widespread farm demonstrations, awareness camps, farmers meetings and trainings to rural youth and farmers across the country in multiple rice growing states.

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Harvesting has been done in most of the plots in the entire region. Various points discussed during the month in these meetings included:

- Yield benefits of DSR technique
- Saving ground water through DSR
- Saving in labour cost
- Significance of Rice Herbicide Portfolio
- Disease and pest pressure in DSR & timely disease and pest management in DSR

- Ease of plant protection in DSR when compared to transplanted rice
- Various alternative techniques of managing rice stubble over usual burning in Punjab and Haryana
- Some of the farmers shared their personal testimonials on being benefited by switching to DSR

Apart from usual field days, regular stewardship and safety trainings are also being organised for farmers to ensure their maximum safety with simultaneous protection of natural resources.

Transforming Rural Livelihood through Farmers Field School

PI Foundation is working closely with small holders' tribal farmers in the agriculturally backward region of Jharkhand. The project was envisaged to enhance the productivity of the farming land through training of farmers. Progressive farmers were identified and five demonstration plots were set up as Farmers Field School (FFS) in the project locations. The centres serve as the learning centre for the local farmers.



The following methodology has been followed during the month of December 2021: The FFS were organised on tri-weekly basis early in the morning for 4-5 hours. Every week three types of activities were conducted. These are:

- Group discussion and presentation
- Field observations and follow up activities
- Hands-on activity on pre-determined activity

To support the training model; practices of Azolla, Vermin Compost, NADEP, Integrated Pest Management (IPM), Integrated Nutrient Management (INM), Vermin wash, Net protection and community-based traditional seed banks are also promoted.





During the current month, 125 farmers participated in 5 demo fields established in East Singhbhum and Saraikela-Kharsawan district of Jharkhand. Farmers learnt the PoP of Tomato, Spinach, Banana, Potato, Elephant Foot Yam and Katchu in the demonstration field. Operations and Service Delivery during the month:

- Firstly, FFS offers classroom trainings to Community mobilizers and Community Resource Persons with the purpose of educating about the significance of adopting various models of sustainable agricultural practices and livestock management practices. This is done through verbal trainings, flip charts, video shows, and practical demonstration with an engaging environment.
- Secondly, field based practical training of Community mobilizers and Community resource persons on models at FFS, tools and machinery are demonstrated and trained.
- Thirdly, community level hand holding training and support has been provided to women farmers on their fields and farms. Based on their needs, training sessions are organised in the community and field support offered in their farms with live demonstrations.

Farmers learnt the following:

- Grow a healthy crop
- Conserve natural enemies - crop pests
- Conduct regular field observations
- Identify weather, water and climate-related issues and constraints with respect to agriculture
- Identify appropriate risk and resource management response options
- Utilize location-specific and cost-effective risk and resource management
- Reduce production costs





Reviving Cotton Production and Increasing Growers' Income in India through Eco-friendly PB Knot Technology



PI Foundation in collaboration with The South Asia Biotechnology Centre (SABC) & Roots Foundation has been implementing an innovative and multi-stakeholder 'PROJECT BANDHAN: A Knot of PBW Protection' to embrace cutting-edge innovation by tagging the environmental friendly PB Knot technology to protect the cotton plant from devastating PBW (Pectinophora gossypiella).

Pink Bollworm (PBW) is one of the major pests of cotton in India. Its infestation is a big menace to cotton cultivation in cotton growing regions of the country. Cotton growers from across the country have to incur huge yield loss due to PBW infestation. 'Project Bandhan' is an exemplary initiative to promote pheromone based IPM production system of cotton. The project involves adopting villages to showcase IPM Package of practices and implement mating disruption technology on a mass scale to control Pink Bollworm (PBW).

As part of the CSR initiative, PI Foundation is supporting the area wide implementation of Project Bandhan and is committed to sustainable agriculture and environmental protection. Selection of plots has been done and implementation is in full swing under the supervision of MDO.





Project Update:

- All plots are in good condition
- Pheromone Trap installation done
- Recorded the observation 15 days interval as per protocol
- Initiated the 2 PLD application
- Created the hype in the PB Knot LPDs
- Collecting the Cotton HNF Farmers
- Crop stage – Now the stage is 1st & 2nd picking
- Pest incidence will be low to medium in all the plots
- Observation- Pheromone traps counts-1-2 PBW / traps
- Rosette flowers counts are negligible
- Taking the observation green boll damage PB damage in our plot and FP
 - Captured the good photographs 2 LPDs
 - 400 Cotton farmers gathered from surrounding villages
 - 2nd Picking from both the LPDs are in progress
 - Recording considerable yield from both LPDs comparing with Farmer practice plot
 - Maximum good opened bolls (GOB's) were recorded in PB knot treated plot compare with farmer practice
 - Boll shattering was very clear and easy to harvest (pick the cotton lint) from PB Knot treated plot compared to farmer practice

- Considerably large no of moth catches were recorded in farmer practice
- Observation on moth catches and record yield data were in progress
- Conducted 5 mega farmers meeting in Keshava Puram village, Warangal territory, South Telangana and Bobligam village, Ranga Reddy territory Andhra along with Halvad, Amreli and Botad market covering 2150 farmers.
- Showcased the PB Knot KPI and KPMs to 550+ Cotton growers and Agriculture Scientists from University also visited LPD and explained about importance of PB Knot technology in Karnataka.

ASMITA Project - Women Empowerment through Improved Access to Credit and Livelihood Initiatives in 20 Villages

ASMITA project is being implemented with an aim to form and strengthen Self Help Groups of women for creating a sustainable base for micro finance activity in 20 villages- 15 villages of Jambusar (Sarod, Nodhna, Uber, Vedach, Samoj, Kavali, Nahar, Kangam, Amanpur, Tundaj, Kareli, Kanhva, Piludra, Nobar & Bhodar) and 5 villages of Panoli area (Panoli, Sanjali, Kapodara, Bakrol & Umarwada).

Coronavirus pandemic created an opportunity to test the resilience of the leadership and systems. Second wave has forced to adapt the new normal stringently. Following interventions were done during the month in Jambusar.

- **Strengthening of SHGs:** Monthly meetings of 124 groups were conducted and 1100 SHG members participated in the meeting. 7 new women joined Self Help Group during the month. The meetings entailed discussions on regularity of conducting meetings, savings, loan repayments, updating records and linking members with Insurance & Govt. schemes. The women were made aware of vaccination drive.

- 2 preliminary meetings held in Kangaam and Amanpur village participated by 27 women.
- **Status of Savings:** 124 groups accumulated total savings of ₹2.79 lac.
- **Status of Loan Accessed:** 5 women accessed loans amounting to ₹1,35,000. This month's loan was majorly availed for initiating income generating activities. 8 SHG women renewed their Joint Liability Group Loan of ₹2,00,000.





- **Record Keeping Training:**

A record keeping training was organised for SHG leaders. Total 24 members attended the training. Current books of accounts were discussed and steps were suggested to maintain books of accounts.

- **Business Development Training:**

A training session was organised for SHG members in Vedach. 15 SHG members participated. The training was organised to introduce wide range of eco-friendly product. The high market demand for such products was also discussed. Demonstration of various products are also done. This session encouraged many women to start making cowdung based products as a livelihood opportunity.

- **Cluster Meetings & Credit Awareness Camp:**

One cluster meeting held in Kareli. 34 women participated in the meeting. Women were encouraged to deposit their savings and loan installments on regular basis. Information regarding insurance schemes was shared like Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Yojana and Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana. SHG members were encouraged to get their families insured under the scheme.

5 Credit Awareness Camps were conducted in Amanpur, Tundaj, Sarod & Kangaam villages. 98 members from 9 Self Help Groups participated in these camps. Discussion held on paying regular savings and credit installments.

- **Leveraging Govt. Schemes:**

- 10 women joined Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana.
- 10 women joined Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana.
- 15 women linked with Aatma project.





Highlights from Panoli:

Monthly meetings of 79 groups were conducted covering 817 SHG members. The meetings entailed discussions on regularity of conducting meetings, savings, loan repayments and linking members with insurance schemes. The women were made aware about vaccination drive and enrollment.

• Status of Savings & Loan:

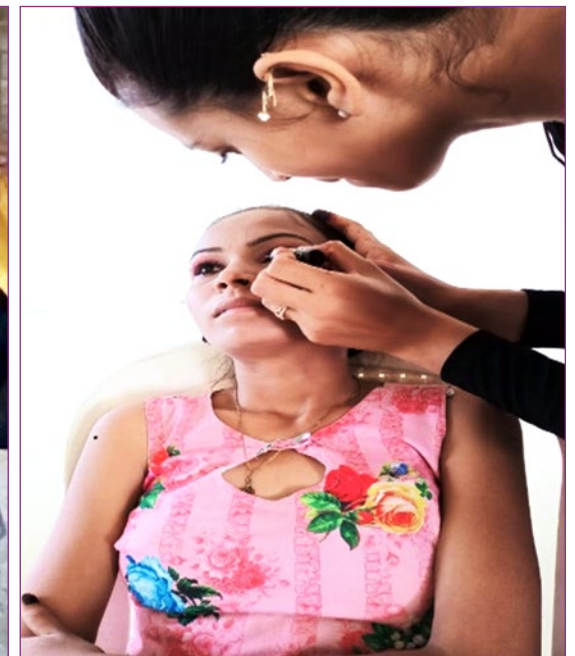
- 76 groups collected total savings of ₹91,500
- A total loan amount of ₹49,000 was availed by 10 women. Majorly loan was availed for initiating income generating activity & health

Skill Training (Beauty Parlour and Tailoring Class):

A beauty parlor training course continued with 15 women from Sanjali and Panoli. Tailoring training also continued in Umarwada village. Total 20 women are participating in tailoring classes. The objective of imparting such training is to allow women to start their own enterprise.

Leveraging Govt Schemes:

15 SHG members were linked with schemes for Sukaniya Yojana, Old Age Pension, Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima and Pradhan Mantri Jivan Jyoti Bima.





Economic Empowerment of Women Smallholders and Workers through Improved Agriculture and Inclusive Dairy Value Chain Promotion

PI Foundation along with CARE India is implementing a CSR project with a focus on agriculture improvement and inclusive dairy value chain promotion in 60 villages of Jambusar taluka. The project has focused on capacity building and improved practices related to agriculture production system and dairy value chain.

SHG / Federation Strengthening:

- Participation in monthly savings meetings of 181 SHGs with the purpose of observing the SHGs functions. Team has ensured the discussion on importance of internal loaning and regular repayment of the loan, federation structure and vision during the saving meetings. Also, the entrepreneurs (Sangini, Beautician, Pashu sakhis, Tailor, Jewelry Making etc.) promote their products and services in the saving meetings.
- Pan card of 3 Federations have been generated.
- Monthly meetings of all federations have been organised at village Runaad in which around 44 members from all 6 federations participated. The discussion done on below given agendas.





- i. Case studies shared by SHG members of their own.
 - ii. Updates on federation activities by every federation representative
 - iii. Promotion and marketing of the products / services of federation / individual members by stalls.
 - iv. Experience sharing and discussion on issues faced in dealing with banks and how federation take this forward.
 - v. Discussion on role of federation in taking up social issues.
- One SHG from village Dabha have regularly repaid the Cash Credit Limit within a year, so the loan has been renewed, they received loan of ₹1,00,000/- from Bank of Baroda. Documents of 8 SHGs have been submitted to Taluka Panchayat for revolving fund process.
 - 10 SHGs got registered on NRLM portal so that they would be able to get benefits of the relevant schemes by GLPC.
 - District Livelihood Manager visited Bojadara village and interacted with members of milk collection center and SHG Momai Maa's members and appreciated their progress.
 - 23 trainings on leadership / management and advance level financial literacy have been organised in which around 214 SHG members participated.
 - 12 Gender dialogues have been organised with 121 couples in project villages.

Income Generating Activities:

- 10 days training on advance level tailoring (Kurti making) has been organised for 12 landless SHG members from project villages and market linkage has been established so that the participants can start earning right away after the training.
- 42 women members are working on box making and earning while utilizing the leisure time at home.
- Thanava federation has been linked with vendor of stone sticking work and establishing the supply chain for this work.
- 10 Bakri Palak Pathshala have been organized to create awareness on good practices of goat rearing and promote pashu sakhhi work in the villages.





Dairy Interventions:

- Members of Sangdi, Madafar, Panchakda and Naada Milk Collection Center (MCC) visited the office of Chairman of District Dudhdhara Dairy to have discussion on identified issues like milk route, repairing of system, supervisor visit at Milk Collection Center (MCC), veterinary services etc. He ensured to resolve the issues in a month.
- Monthly meeting of Milk Collection Centers of excellence has been organised in which 12 MCCs members participated, and the members were given PPE Kit.
- General meeting for all customers has been conducted at Bojadara and Panchkada Milk Collection Centers. Supervisor of Dudhdhara dairy has facilitated the meeting.
- Panchakda Milk Collection Center got registered under milk cooperative society.

Agricultural Interventions:

- TOT for cluster coordinators and change agents have been organised on soil and water conservation. 127 Agri leaders have been capacitated by cluster coordinators and change agents on above mention topics of TOT.

- 5 Farmer Field Business School sessions on land preparation, seed treatment and sowing have been organised on wheat demonstration plots in which 68 female farmers and 37 male farmers participated.
- 7 FFBS sessions on sowing has been organized with scale up for kitchen garden farmers in which 56 female and 29 male farmers participated.
- 20 farmers have been given Napier stems which would cover 3.6 hectares of barren land. 2 FFBS on Napier plantation have been organised in which 14 female and 6 male farmers participated.





Employability-linked Skill Development Centre at Jambusar

PI Foundation along with Rural Shores has been running Skill Development Centre in Jambusar. At the centre, unemployed and underprivileged youth are trained with vocational training courses across various sectors to generate employment after the course completion. New trade as 'electrician' has been introduced this year and has replaced 'food & beverage service stewards' basis the post-covid assessment of potential employment opportunities in nearby areas. The courses are for 3 months (Min 500 Hrs per trainee) with an annual intake of 400 students.

PI Foundation Skill Development Centre has been running after ease of COVID 19 second wave with strict adherence of protocol. Total 387 students enrolled in 2021-22. 226 students successfully completed their courses and 137 got placement. Currently batch is running with 161 students-30 enrolled for trade 'electrician', 96 for 'BPO executive', 35 in 'Advance Excel'.





Improving Learning Outcomes in 135 Govt. Elementary Schools of Jambusar

PI Foundation in collaboration with Pratham Education Foundation has been implementing a CSR project to improve learning outcomes of over 12,000 children enrolled in Govt. Elementary Schools located in 82 Villages of Jambusar Block. The project envisages age & grade appropriate learning standards for students in 135 schools of Jambusar taluka in Bharuch district.

Highlights during the month:

- Total **5545** children (from grade I-VIII) participated in regular activities
- 10 days 1st Learning camp completed in 23 schools
- Light activities completed in 23 Schools
- Science Workshop completed in schools & community in all villages
- Library Groups are running in all villages
- Daily home activities through messages sharing is going on in all villages

Learning Camp:

- 40 days Learning Camp running in 23 Schools by Cluster Resource Leader.
- 10 days 1st Learning Camp completed in 23 schools.
- Total 696 childrens from standard 3 to 5 in the category of beginner, letter and word level are part of Learning Camps.

Light Activities:

- Light activities running with 1128 children from std 1&2 in 23 schools.
- Light activities are organized for class 1 & 2 children for an hour.





Science Workshop:

- Human Body workshop completed in 57 villages at the school level by Vigyan Mitra. Total 1334 children covered under this workshop.
- Brain Cap, Eyes and Ear Model Workshop completed in 31 villages at the community level. Total 584 children covered from std 6 to 8.
- Pen paper assessment completed with 1576 children in 65 schools.



Library Group Activities:

- Library Groups are running in 80 villages through volunteers. A total of 168 Groups actively participated in day to day activities. Total 847 children were covered from std 3 to 8.

Daily Home Activities:

- Daily messages shared with 2542 children from std 3 to 6 and 1714 children from std 7 to 8.
- Daily messages shared with 1289 children from std 1 & 2.
