Project Vridhhi - Improved Health and Nutrition Status of Children and Adolescents

PI Foundation in collaboration with Institute for Global Development (IGD) has been implementing Project Vridhhi to create an integrated model towards improved health and nutrition status of children and adolescents based on a continuum of intensive care approach in Jambusar block of Bharuch district.

Objectives

- Identify and intervene with the vulnerable children and adolescents for health and nutritional improvement
- Promote behavioral change on health and nutrition by involving adolescents and peer groups of the region
- Enhance the knowledge and skill-sets of healthcare providers, ICDS functionaries and school teachers to promote health & nutrition of children and adolescents

- Engage all the community stakeholders along with parents through advocacy and liaising for necessary social & behavioral change towards health & nutrition.





Highlights

Regular Anganwadi and Household visits were made continuously to engage at the community level to enhance their knowledge and promote health and nutrition with the objective of improving the health status of children, pregnant and lactating women. The growth status of children was monitored during these visits along with counselling mothers and family members for locally available balanced diet food. They were also referred to CMTC centre for diagnostic treatment. Currently, the nutrition supplementation implementation is in process to improve the nutritional status of malnourished children.



Total 438 students were treated covering 16 Anganwadi centres and 9 schools

As part of the collaboration with Ataapi Foundation, SHG group meetings are ongoing in Sarod, Nobar, Vedach. In this month, one meeting was organized in Piludra. IEC materials developed were distributed within schools as well as at the Anganwadi centres. In schools, through the use of these materials, some of the discussions revolve around nutrition, adolescent health, and reproductive health. Sessions were conducted with adolescent girls on menstrual hygiene and anaemia. Peer leaders are being identified from each school now.

Free Health Camp on Eye, Dermatology & Dental Hygiene at Dehgam, Jambusar

PI Foundation organized a free Health Camp on Eye, Dermatology & Dental Hygiene at Government Girls School, Dehgam, Jambusar. The Camp was inaugurated by Member, Taluka Panchayat, Jambusar, Medical Officers and School Principal. Dr Ritu Ojha - Dentist, Dr. Maitri Patel - Dermatologist and Dr. Twisha Tandel, Ophthalmologist from Gotri Hospital, Vadodara lead the initiative. Local Sarpanchs and community leaders from surrounding villages participated in the Camp and applauded the efforts.

The Camp aims to contribute towards specialized healthcare for marginalized community members. Information, Education and Communication (IEC) activity was carried out prior to the scheduled camp. The Camp engaged experienced doctors and facilitated free checkup in dental, eye and skin care.

Reviving Cotton Production and Increasing Growers' Income in India through Eco-friendly PB Knot Technology



PI Foundation in collaboration with the South Asia Biotechnology Centre (SABC) has been implementing an innovative and multi-stakeholder 'PROJECT BANDHAN: A Knot of PBW Protection' to embrace cutting-edge innovation by tagging the environmentally-friendly PB Knot Technology to protect the cotton plant from devastating PBW (*Pectinophora gossypiella*).

Kharif 2022-23: Project Bandhan ended with multiple high impact field activities to showcase and popularize country-wide impact of PB Knot mating disruption technology in North, Central and Southern cotton growing zone. The national team of scientists of ICAR-National Centre for Integrated Pest Management (NCIPM), New Delhi and ICAR-Central Institute of Cotton Research (CICR) Nagpur in collaboration with KVK Wardha inspected Ratanpur village of Wardha district in Vidarbha region, Maharashtra. A team of ICAR NCIPM principal scientists visited PB Knot mating disruption cluster to see the effectiveness and interacted with

farmers involved in demonstration of PB Knot Technology for the management of pink bollworm in cotton in Vidarbha region of Maharashtra. The NCIPM / CICR scientists meticulously surveyed the cotton fields of Project Bandhan, randomly collected and dissected green bolls from PB Knot cluster and the control plot to examine the level of pink bollworm infestation, and measured the damage and relative intensity of infestation, showing a clear-cut difference and the impact of mating disruption PB Knot Technology in effectively reducing PBW damage.





Celebrating Kisan Divas as part of National Farmers Day, Project Bandhan organized two big farmer melas in Guntur district of Andhra Pradesh demonstrating the day-in and day-out grassroots engagement with smallholder growers to strengthen their capacity to tackle the challenge of pink bollworm, reduce cost of production and improve quality food production system. 2 farmer melas, field visits and interaction with cotton entomologists from ANGRAU, local officials and team of experts from SABC and PI Industries in the PBKnot clusters was organized. PB Knot experts interacted with **300 farmers** in village Gottipadu/Ganikapudi village of Prathipadu Taluka, Guntur District of Andhra Pradesh to educate them about the field experience of PB Knot Technology.

Similarly, Project Bandhan team hosted another mega farmer mela in PB Knot cluster directly engaging **250 cotton farmers** in village Kornepadu village of Prathipadu Taluka, Guntur District of Andhra Pradesh. Regular and professional interactions with smallholder cotton farmers reflects Project Bandhan's foot-on-the-ground approach to help growers cope innovatively with emerging challenges of biotic stress such as pink bollworm.





Project Bandhan also continued and intensified the off-season pink bollworm management awareness campaign in the North cotton growing zone. Project Bandhan team also visited many cotton ginneries and organized one-on-one meetings with cotton ginners about the need to install pheromone traps, train them and distributed pheromone traps to 2 dozen cotton ginneries. The ginneries were told to not only install but also frequently replace pheromone lures and monitor the adult moth catches and report it to local agriculture department accordingly.

Operation Nalla Tamara Purugu: an integrated approach for Chilli Black Thrips Management

PI Foundation has devised and launched a mega grassroot project '**Operation Nalla Tamara Purugu**' to demonstrate and popularize IPM based practices for the management of black thrips, in Chilli in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. Nalla Tamara Purugu, a polyphagous invasive pest has been affecting chilli farmers in the region for the last 2 years.

Operation Nalla Tamara Purugu is implemented by the South Asia Biotechnology Centre in collaboration with local organizations and value chain partners in respective states. PI Foundation has selected intensive chilli growing areas of Guntur, Prakasham, East and West Godavari districts of Andhra Pradesh and neighboring Telangana's chilli growing areas of Warangal, Bhadrachalam, Mahabubabad & Khammam.





Rolling out field demonstrations and mega farmers outreach cum field training program in November and December to sensitize farmers about IPM based control measure of Nalla Tamara Purugu in Village Garudachalapalem, Taluka Medikonduru of Guntur district and Village Ravinuthala, Taluka Korisapadu of Bapatla districts respectively. More than **450 chilli growing farmers** from **6 villages** participated in farmers meetings in both locations in December & January. The on-farm farmer meetings were represented by PI Foundation, PI Industries Ltd., South Asia Biotechnology Centre, ITC Ltd., EFFORT NGO, Vihanga Technologies and public and private sector representatives.



- Facilitation to 650 chilli farmers in interaction with experts
- Distribution of handouts of chilli Black thrips including life cycle, symptoms and damage and control measures in Telugu language
- Distribution of safety PPE kits to comply with safety requirements
- Honouring progressive farmers with operation Nalla Tamara Purugu branded products
- Installation of multi-colored sticky traps in demonstration field
- Drone-based spraying to demonstrate application of IPM based control measures including botanical, microbials and new chemistry focusing on Keefun & Fosmite, Broflanilidae, Neem oil 10,000 ppm and Baveria basiana and Iecanicillium Iecanii in demonstrating chilli fields.





Intensifying our efforts, we were delighted to share our learnings with chilli growers at the chilli field of practicing farmers of Guntur and Prakasm districts. We demonstrated a blend of traditional knowledge and modern practices including cultural practices, botanical, microbial and new chemistry by drone application for managing chilli black thrips in Prakasam district, elaborated by Prof. P Balasubramanian of South Asia Biotechnology Centre.

In accelerating field activities, Operation Nalla Tamara Purugu expert team visited and interacted with chilli scientists of Horticulture Research Station (HRS), Lam, Guntur, which has been a centre of excellence in horticulture research and has been proactively addressing the threat of invasive black thrips in Chilli.

“Operation Nalla Tamara Purugu has laid out IPM field demonstration, intensive field-oriented training programs, create knowledge resources and deploy new methods of cultural, microbial and innovative molecules to manage devastating black thrips in Chilli in next 2-3 years in AP and Telangana chilli growing areas,” stated Mr. Shivaram Krishna Reddy, Regional Manager of PI Industries Ltd.



ASMITA Project- Women Empowerment through Improved access to credit and livelihood initiatives in 20 Villages

ASMITA project is being implemented with an aim to form and strengthen self-help groups of women for creating a sustainable base for micro finance activity in 20 villages- 15 villages of Jambusar (Sarod, Nodhna, Uber, Vedach, Samoj, Kavali, Nahar, Kangam, Amanpur, Tundaj, Kareli, Kanhva, Piludra, Nobar and Bhodar) and 5 villages of Panoli area (Panoli, Sanjali, Kapodara, Bakrol and Umarwada).

Highlights of Jambusar

- **Strengthening of SHGs:** Monthly meetings of 125 group out of 126 groups were conducted during the month. This month, SHG members were counselled on making compost and vermicompost with cattle waste as majority of the people are involved in animal husbandry. Benefits of organic compost was explained and how the excess can be sold to generate extra income was discussed.

This month, 4 new members joined existing Self Help Groups.

- **Saving:** Total savings of 126 Groups (till date) : ₹1.04 crore
 - Internal lending of Loan: ₹44.81 lacs
 - Members of 126 SHGs deposited their savings amounting to ₹2,56,096 in Jambusar during the month. Total cumulative saving in FY 2022-23 is ₹19.98 lacs



Highlights of Panoli

- Total 80 group meetings were conducted in the month out of which 38 meetings were conducted by SHG leaders and remaining 42 meetings were conducted by Project staff. During the meeting, counselling on timely payment of loan availed through NRLM was done. SHG members were also told to gather relevant documents for application of Cash Credit loan and Revolving Fund. Further, they were motivated for internal lending and starting their own enterprise. SHG members were encouraged to buy housekeeping products made by their fellow members.
- **Saving:** Total savings of 80 Groups (till date): ₹30.24 lacs
 - Internal lending of Loan: ₹11.63 lacs
 - Members of 80 SHGs deposited their savings amounting to ₹1,14,200 in Panoli during the month. Total cumulative saving in FY 2022-23 is ₹11.88 lacs

Linkages with Government Schemes

From April 2022 to January 2023, total 126 groups out of 210 have been linked with NRLM surpassing the key deliverable for 2022-23 target. Registration of remaining groups is in progress.

In January, 2 groups of Panoli and 3 groups of Jambusar were registered in National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM) Bharuch.



Village Organisation

- **Jambusar:** Formation of New Village Organisation (VO) in Jambusar is on hiatus as NRLM's target for the current year is complete.

Skill Training for Income Generating Activities

Training for making paper bags was given to 15 SHG members of Umarwada village of Panoli cluster over a period of 5 days. Women were taught to make bags from newspaper, making bags with handles, paper



bags for weddings and other functions, cover for perfume bottle, ring boxes, box cover for cosmetics and packaging boxes for snacks.

Financial & Legal Literacy Training and Bank Linkage workshop:

2 trainings on Financial & Legal Literacy were conducted in Jambusar and Ankleshwar for leaders of 43 groups to cover: financial planning, maintaining individual passbooks, interface with banks, terms and conditions of loan along with rights of women. Bank linkage sessions were also conducted to leverage resources from bank and encourage women not doing savings and internal lending, schematic linkages, developing social enterprises, resolving internal issues of the group and registration with NRLM.

Linkages with Govt. Schemes: Documents from 135 SHG women were collected and submitted to concerned Govt. department for linkage to rights entitled to them in Jambusar & Ankleshwar.

Economic Empowerment of Women Smallholders and Workers through Improved Agriculture and Inclusive Dairy Value Chain Promotion

CARE India with the support of PI Foundation is implementing a project titled 'Economic Empowerment of Women Smallholders and Landless Workers through Strengthening and Graduating Community-Based Institutions' (IAIDVC) in 59 villages of Jambusar block of Bharuch district in Gujarat. The project is working with 3427 women smallholders through 300 Self Help Groups (SHGs), 6 cluster-level federations and 1 block-level federation. The goal of the project is to enable women smallholders, landless workers and their institutions to sustain improved practices of enhanced livelihood returns with institutionalization of coherent convergence of eco-system actors.

Key Highlights - Strengthening of SHGs and Federation

SHG Meetings: SHG monthly saving meetings have been an important part of the SHG women and they follow this major part of the 'Panch Sutra' religiously. Cluster-level federations along with the support of SHG guides and village-level volunteers ensure the monthly saving meetings of the SHGs. In this month, 171 SHG monthly meetings were attended by the field team, federation members and volunteers with the purpose of observing the SHGs functions. Federation has ensured discussion on importance of internal loaning and regular repayment of the loan, federation structure and vision during the saving meetings. Also, the entrepreneurs (Sangini, Beautician, Pashu Sakhi, Tailor, Jewelry Making and other enterprises) promote their products and services in the saving meetings.





Federations: Cluster-level federations also organize a monthly meeting of the members in the villages. These meetings help them discuss their plans, work out solutions to challenges and align their objectives with those of the block-level federation. In this month all 6 cluster-level federations had their monthly meetings with 53 members and 13 male champions of the respective villages. Male champions play a supportive role in the meeting and participate in the discussion. To create a sense of ownership among the block-level federation, project engages the committee members in all interventions. The project team shares the last month's achievements / updates and the plan for the next month according to the Detailed Implementation Plan (DIP) and gets feedback / suggestions.

Internal loan: The availability of paperless loans at low-interest rates through SHGs has become one of the noticeable changes in a rural community as SHGs have become a way to get rid of private money lenders and Microfinance institutions' trap of high-interest loans. Thus, women's engagement in SHGs is being supported by the family and recognized by society.

₹210,500 has been accessed by 13 SHGs members as an internal loan. The purpose of taking loan were mainly purchasing agriculture input

material, cattle feed, goat purchase, starting small petty shop, cutter machine and medical help, children's education, support in group enterprise etc. Some members took loan to arrange for travel as they are participating in the village-level study.

Bank Linkage: Because of regular interaction with the banks, interface meetings and support of Bank Sakhis, SHG and federations members visit the banks without hesitation or fear. In this month federation continuously followed up for the SHGs saving bank accounts with Baroda Gujarat Gramin Bank Jambusar. 37 SHGs documents have been submitted to the respective banks for the process of Cash Credit Limit and 20 SHGs documents were submitted for opening of bank account.





Block Level Federation Meeting

This practice gives them sense of the process as well as team's accountability towards federation. In this month, the monthly meeting was organized at office with all the federation members.

Advocacy Training of Federation Members

The block level federation has been working diligently over the past 8 months. Mr. Kirit Bhai, an Expert conducted an advocacy training of the members of this federation. He provided details on the essential processes of advocacy, how to communicate with the government and other authorities at the district and taluka levels, and how to make representations. He effectively imparted the principles of discourse, relationships, and communication to our Jambusar Mahila Vikas Mahamandal members.

Agriculture Activities from Seed to Market

For healthy and productive crops, every stage from seed selection to storage and marketing is critical. IAIDVC team understands this and so do the farmers.



To track all the information related to every stage of crop, POP farmers have been given farmers diaries. Also, federation is playing a role in linking farmers with KVK to get wheat seeds on time and, with the support of SHG guides, getting updates on the demo plots on their growth.

Participatory Performance Tracker: In IAIDVC project we have introduced improved package of practices in agriculture and ensured the adoption of these practices through FFBS. Using this tool, we are discussing with the women farmers on the adoption of practices, outcomes, the challenges and gaps. These discussions also cover the gender aspect, market linkages and more.



Milk Collection Centre

Recognition fuels the progress of any intervention. In IAIDVC project there are 6 Milk Collection Centers (MCC), which are running successfully since last 4 years exclusively managed by SHG women members. MCC members have been adopting best practices to move ahead towards becoming centers of excellence. The efforts have been recognized by giving the award to best performing MCC. For last quarter the award (table & milk cane) was given to Panchkada MCC. Selection of MCC for the award was done by all block level federation members.



MCC members are determined to achieve success. The Panchkada MCC member visited the Taluka Development Officer (TDO) Jambusar and requested him for support in building the Milk Collection Center premises. The village panchayat has allotted the land to the MCC and now they are exploring for support in construction.

Master Trainers Training

Master trainers are women who have gained skill in one or another profession and are now ready to train others. 2 day Training of Trainers (ToT) was organized for 14 master trainers on various topics covering leadership, team building, communication, management, life skills etc. After the training, master trainers felt their self-confidence increased and planned for further engagements.

Orientation on Pashu Sakhi

An orientation meeting on Pashu Sakhi was organized for SHG guides to provide updates on different seasonal diseases and recommend herbal medicine. Pashu Palak Pathshala has been organized in every month by the SHG guide team and facilitated in villages.



Community Orientation on Safety & Emergency Preparedness in surrounding villages of Jambusar & Panoli Plant

PI Foundation with technical support from EHS department organized orientation sessions for community members on Health, safety, environment along with emergency preparedness in Sarod, Nodhna, Uber, Vedach, Piludara, Kareli, Amanpur and Samoj of Jambusar taluka & Bakrol, Sanjali, Kapodara, Umarwada, and Panoli of Ankleshwar taluka. This orientation was part of regular interface with community on Health, Safety, Environment & Emergency preparedness along with Financial & Legal literacy sessions.

Valedictory Function of 10th batch of Vocational Training Program on Chemical Plant Operators at DDU, Nadiad

PI Foundation in association with Dharmsinh Desai University-Anchor Institute-Chemicals & Petrochemicals, Nadiad, promoted by the Centre for Entrepreneurship Development - Industries Commissionerate, Government of Gujarat initiated the 10th batch of Vocational Training Program on “Chemical Plant Operators” in November 2022 with 50 fresh science graduates (B.Sc & M.Sc.).

Total 358 students have completed the course since it’s inception and 90% of them have been placed in companies.

Valedictory function for 10th batch of Vocational Training Program on “Chemical Plant Operators” at Dharmsinh Desai University, Nadiad was held on 27th Jan, 2023. Dr Sachin Parikh Joint Director, Technical Education, Govt of Gujarat along with Sh. Kamlesh Mehta, Head, Technical Services, PI Industries Ltd, Sh. Ankur Desai, Campus Director, Dharmsinh Desai University, Nadiad, Dean- Faculty of Technology, and HoD, Chemical Engineering department of DDU graced the function.

All 50 students have successfully completed the course and awarded certificates. All 50 students have also got placement in nearby companies.





Employability-linked Skill Development Centre, Jambusar

PI Foundation along with Rural Shores has been running Skill Development Centre in Jambusar to train unemployed and underprivileged youth with vocational training courses across various sectors to generate employment. Currently 4 courses are running in the Centre - Advance Excel, BPO, BFSI and Electrician trade. The courses are for 3 months (Min 500 hrs per trainee) with an annual intake of 480 students.

Improving Learning Outcomes in 135 Govt. Elementary Schools of Jambusar

PI Foundation in collaboration with Pratham Education Foundation has been implementing a CSR project to improve learning outcomes of over 12,000 children enrolled in Govt. Elementary Schools located in 82 villages of Jambusar Block. The project envisages age & grade appropriate learning standards for students in 135 schools of Jambusar taluka in Bharuch district.



Highlights



- 40-day Learning Camp completed in 18 schools with Std. 3-5. 10-day fourth Learning Camp completed in 18 schools. 10-day first Learning Camp running in 8 schools with targeted children in phase 2
- Assessment completed with 547 children in Std. 3 to 5 in 8 schools. After assessment, 10-day Learning Camp completed with 246 children
- Light activities completed with 932 children in Std. 1&2 in 18 schools. In phase 2, Light activities are being organized with 393 children in Std. 1&2 in 8 schools
- Community Instructors organise Light activities with Std. 1 & 2 for an hour
- Light activities of Math and Language are being organized with all children under Light activities. Community Instructors also organise Balgeet and fun activities



Advance Learning Camp



- 10-day second Learning Camp completed in 14 schools and 10-day second Learning Camp running in 7 schools with targeted children
- Before start of Advance Camp, CIM tested pen paper assessment of Std. 6 to 8 children. Pen Paper assessment completed with 810 children in Std. 6 to 8. Advance Camp is running with 368 targeted children under 14 schools
- Community Instructors organize Learning Camp activities based upon CAMaL methodologies. CIMs are also organising Math and Language activities with Std. 6 to 8 children for practice
- CIM is facilitating Advance Math and Language activities with Std. 6 to 8 children daily. CIMs are also coordinating with school teachers, Sarpanch, SMC members and parents and inform them on progress of Advance Learning Camp model on weekly basis





Science Assessment



- Magnet workshop and Community workshop completed in 80 schools with children of Std. 6 to 8
- 2546 children participated in the Magnet workshop and practice with science models for 2 days
- Community workshop completed with 2895 children practically for water topic in 80 schools
- 3-day Science Training organized for CIMs at Ahmedabad. This training was focussed on topics Nature-2, Light-1 and Microscope-2
- Post training 2 days Piloting Workshop completed under 3 schools with 83 children on Nature topic by CIM. Besides Nature-2 workshop also completed with 216 children in 8 schools and running in other 19 schools

Library Group Activities



- Library Groups are running in 82 villages through volunteers
- Total 548 Groups actively participated in Library activities. Total 2716 children covered from Std. 3 to 8; 1,347 children covered from Std. 3 to 5 and 1,369 children covered from Std. 6 to 8.
- CIM provided day-wise material to all 3 to 5 and 6 to 8 Library groups and also visited the groups on daily basis to support children and volunteers.



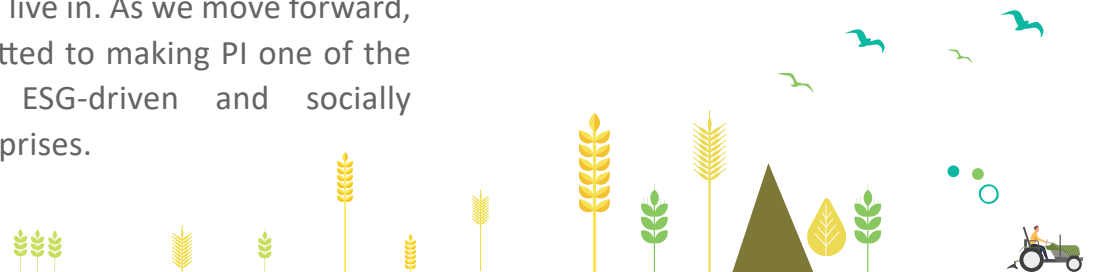
PROUD WINNER OF **GOLDEN PEACOCK AWARD** for Corporate Social Responsibility 2022
